Their purpose is to empower the lives of women and children to successfully navigate the negative conditions in their lives by using tools such as volunteerism, cultural awareness, and the fine arts to improve their community.

Rouse and WODE are honored to bring OCC to the mothers of Project WARM (Women Assisting Recovering Mothers), a program of Stewart-Marchman-Act Behavioral Healthcare (SMA) that focuses on long-term residential drug and alcohol treatment for women who are pregnant, post-partum, or parenting young children.

The event will take place on December 11, 2010 with the help of Stewart-Marchman-Act Foundation, the fundraising arm of SMA. Families will receive a professional photography experience and a catered meal, as well as a gift basket filled with clothing, supplies and gift cards, and printed and framed portraits.
